Reort on the Study Program in Udla

- The study program in Udla has shown notable progress over the recent months. Overall, the students are learning well and demonstrating gradual improvement in both subjects (Urdu and English). Although a few of them remain very weak and struggle to understand lessons despite repeated efforts, the majority of the students have shown positive development. Their pace of learning is slow, but they are certainly better than before.
- At the beginning of the program, most students were unable to read or write Urdu. Their Urdu foundation was extremely weak. Alhamdulillah, many of them have now learnt to read Urdu, and some have also progressed to writing. While their writing skills are still developing, their improvement is clearly visible compared to the starting stage.
- Being from a rural background, the students were also very far from the English language. Initially, they had little to no exposure to English words. Alhamdulillah, a good number of students have now learnt basic English vocabulary and their meanings, which is a significant step forward.

- Along with language skills, the students have also learnt important religious basics. These include the Faraiz (obligatory acts) of Wudu, Ghusl, and Salah. This foundational knowledge is helping them strengthen their religious understanding and daily practice.
- One major challenge that still remains is punctuality. Despite consistent guidance and efforts, most students are not regular in attending classes on time. Although there is slight improvement, the overall change is still limited. It is hoped that in the near future they will become more punctual and disciplined.
- Additionally, two girls have expressed a strong desire to continue their education up to high school level. However, they do not have their Class 8 marksheets as both of them left school after Class 4. They are motivated to study again and wish to prepare for high school examinations.
- Overall, the Udla study program is progressing well. With continued effort, consistent support, and improved discipline, the students are expected to achieve even better results in the coming months.
